



Model United Nations as a tool to promote global mental health in high school students.



BACKGROUND

- Model United Nations (MUN): •
 - Educational tool -> students simulate the UN Diplomats meetings.
- Debates/negotiations about solutions to topics of global interest.
- Typical topics: international law, economics and politics.
- World Health Organization (WHO) Assembly on Global Mental Health with topics:
 - 1. Mental health of the refugees, migrants and other vulnerable populations
- 2. Adolescents and psychoeducation.

METHODS

- Event: New York Model UN for Latin America and the Caribbean (NYMUNLAC 2019)
 - Participants:102 high school students
 - Location: UN Headquarters in New York.



<u>Pre event</u>:

- Students were divided into Delegations (represented country) to act as Ambassadors
- Two training workshops:
 - 1. UN procedural rules
 - 2. Global mental health and topics in Agenda
- Global Mental Health Panel.
- Submission of Position Statement per Delegation.
- <u>Data Collection</u>: Survey Pre- and Post-event
- Evaluation:
 - Evaluation per learning objectives and competencies.
 - Written documentation \bullet
 - Public speaking
 - Negotiations/Debate
 - Conflict Resolutions.
 - Simulated "global crisis" -> challenged to solve it in 2 hours.


